1. Words are fingerspelled accurately.
2. Acronyms are formed accurately (e.g. G.U.A.A., A.V.L.I.C.).
3. Words that should be spelled are present.
4. Fingerspells those words which should be spelled and sings those concepts which should be signed.
5. Fingerspelling is accurately used for emphasis.
6. The spelling rhythm is uniform within and between words.
7. Individual letters are clearly presented.
8. The hand is relatively stationary and in an appropriate location.
9. Words are spelled at an understandable speed.
10. Mouthing of fingerspelled words is appropriate.
11. Numbers are assigned accurately.
12. Numbering systems are used accurately.
13. Incorporation of numbers is accurate.
14. Non-specific number signs are accurate (e.g. FEW, MANY).
15. Numbers are clearly presented.
16. The pace is uniform within and between numbers.
17. Numbers are signed at a readable speed.
18. ASL vocabulary is accurate.
19. Signs are formed accurately.
20. A diverse range of ASL vocabulary is used.
21. Vocabulary appropriate to the setting and the consumer is used (e.g. MICRO-WAVE, a newly elected prime minister).
22. Classifiers are used accurately.
23. SASSes are used accurately.
24. Classifiers are structurally accurate.
25. Classifiers are sued as extensively as the text allows.
26. Pictorial outlining is accurate.
27. The noun is identified prior to using a classifier.
28. SASSes are signed after the noun or pronoun.

Structuring Space

Composure and Appearance

50. Refers back to the topic when a pronoun is used accurately (e.g. The stock Aldus is doing well. It (INDEX) should be brought immediately).
51. Interprets the speaker's comments accurately in the first person.
52. Eye contact is appropriate.
53. Accurately uses both hands for signing (e.g. indexes on passive hand, indicates a spatial relationship).
54. The signing is controlled (e.g. smooth).
55. The size of signing is appropriate.
56. The interpreter is composed while interpreting.
57. Good posture is maintained.
58. The interpreter's mannerisms are appropriate.
59. The interpreter's appearance is appropriate.
